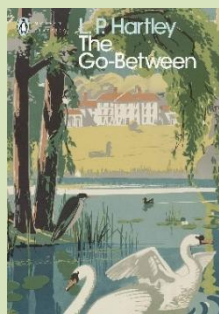

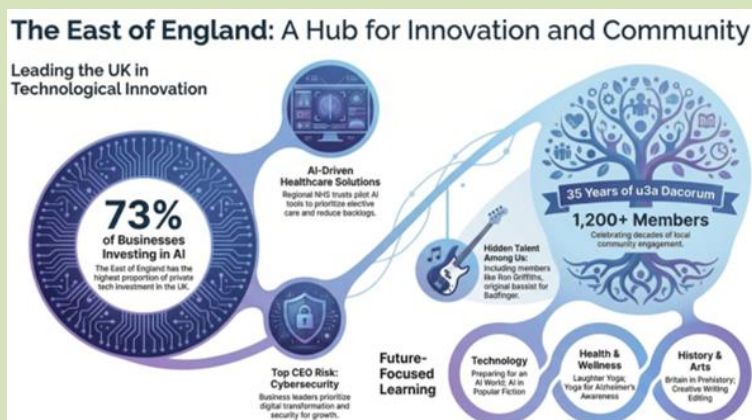

which proved to be perfectly adequate, comfortable, and

incredibly handy for reaching many of the talks, workshops, and events.

The festival got off to a great start with Johnny Ball performing the opening ceremony. He gave a short speech about the importance of our age group remaining engaged and active in society.

One of the great highlights of the festival was the opportunity to socialise and meet fellow u3a members who had travelled from all over the country. We also met some Sudbury and Bury St. Edmunds members.

The festival programme was very varied. On the first day I attended a fascinating astrology talk, followed by a brilliant, guided walk through York's famous "snickelways"—the historic city's narrow hidden alleys and footpaths. The following day I visited the chocolate museum, which was a delicious highlight, as we received several free samples and of course I also had to splash out on some very expensive handmade chocolates.

Meanwhile Ruth enjoyed a lively handbells workshop, run by our very own Hilary Holt from Bedford u3a, a singing group, and tried her hand at jewellery making. She also attended some 'meet the Board and Council' sessions which gave members the opportunity to ask

The presentation will be of interest to members of local history groups, those researching family history and anyone finding out about the Second World War. The charity

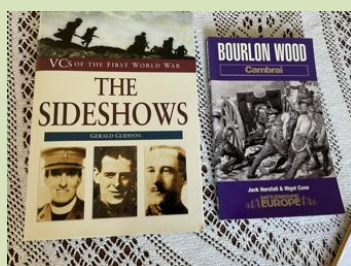
maintains hundreds of graves in churchyards across the East of England.

Victims of fraud from someone they trusted being sought



HELP from members on yet another university research project has been requested.

This time it is from Shannon Edwards, a Trainee Clinical Psychologist on the Doctorate in Clinical Psychology (DClinPsy) programme at the University of Leicester.

She says: "I am currently conducting doctoral research exploring the experiences of adults aged 65 and over who have been affected by fraud or deception by someone they knew or

trusted, such as a partner, family member, friend, or professional.

"This research aims to improve understanding of how these experiences affect older adults, inform clinical practice, and support the development of services and safeguarding strategies. Participation involves a confidential interview lasting up to 75 minutes, which can be conducted in person or online via Microsoft Teams. All identifiable information will be removed to protect participants' identities. In addition, all participants will receive a £20 Love2Shop voucher as a thank you for their time."

This research has been reviewed and approved by the University of Leicester Research Ethics Committee, and a distress protocol and safeguarding procedure are in place, in line with University policy.

Pei Su is the founder and CEO of ACTAsia (Action for Compassion Together) - a United Nations-award-winning charity with the aim to teach children, professionals and consumers to be kinder to people, animals and the planet.

She'll be sharing a lifetime of stories from her years as a global activist - from her time undercover exposing animal abuse to her work helping "left-behind" children in rural China.

She'll also be explaining the ideas behind the charity's "Caring For Life" courses - and the lessons we can all learn from them as well.

"Like u3a, ACTAsia believes in challenging the definition of traditional education," says Pei. So far we've helped more than half a million children, 4,000 vets and an untold number of consumers. We're changing the world through education. And I'm hoping that by sharing our stories, we can inspire others to think about the acts of compassion they could do too."

Pei will be sharing the triumphs, tragedies and joys of being a female charity boss and discussing the charity's ultimate goal: to increase society's compassion for animals, the planet and each other.
